# **Grant Update**

#### **Youth Grant**

The Foundation Board has updated the criteria for the Youth Grant, removing the one-time only clause. Previously, Clubs could only apply for a one time annual grant to a youth organization. Clubs can now apply for a \$500 grant when they make a \$1000 donation to a youth organization - one grant per club per year, up to 20 per District. A Club can now support the same organization year after year.

We choose students who have a minimum 70% academic average, a financial need, and who have demonstrated service and leadership in keeping with the Kiwanis spirit. The Club also awards an annual \$2,000 music scholarship in honour of the late John Bird, former club President and a pillar of the music industry in Canada.

Each scholarship winner is invited to the luncheon, together with family, friends and the school faculty members.



The Kiwanis Foundation of Canada provides financial assistance for this scholarship program through its Matching Scholarship and Mel Osborne Scholarship programs.
